



Corridor C / SH 29 Bypass Study

Greetings,

Per your request to stay informed, here is an update on the Corridor C / SH 29 Bypass Study.

Feedback received from individual property owner meetings have propelled the team to move forward with the preliminary (schematic) design showing the ultimate improvements proposed in the area.

When the schematic is completed, the County will move forward with final design of an interim 3-lane project that will serve as a future frontage road for the ultimate buildout. The Phase 1 project will allow for roadway expansion as development occurs without the need for reconstruction. This phasing allows for the road to be expanded in the future without having to tear out what is built in the near term. The Phase 1 engineering design and ROW funds have been identified. ROW discussions will begin late summer 2019. Construction funding has not been identified yet.

The project team is continuing to work on refining the schematic, and we anticipate completion of this phase of work by mid-2019.

Survey and environmental crews have been working in the field and will continue working in the Corridor C project area to collect more detailed information. While in the field, survey crews use flags to aid in documenting locations of trees. These flags only pertain to the tree inventory and do not indicate proposed tree removal. Stakes are used to help locate property lines and match points for the survey, and do not represent project plans or locations of the road.

Obtaining precise surveys along the project limits is an essential part of the project development as the design is refined. Survey work should be completed in the next few months, weather and field conditions permitting. Environmental crews will continue to conduct field work in the area over the next several months to gather additional information.
