

2019 PROPOSED PARK BOND PROJECTS



In the November 5, 2019, General Election, Williamson County voters will have the opportunity to vote on two propositions regarding issuing road bonds and park bonds. Proposition B will authorize the county to issue bonds not to exceed \$35 million for park and recreational purposes. If approved by voters, the bond proceeds are proposed to be used for the following projects:



HIKE AND BIKE TRAILS

- Bagdad Trail from Leander to Liberty Hill
- Trail extension from Cedar Park Lakeline Park to Twin Lakes Park
- Trail extension south and eastward along Hairy Man Road
- Trails including an extension of Brushy Creek Regional Trail from Red Bud Lane to Hutto
- Regional Park trail extension northward towards Lake Georgetown Trail and southward towards Brushy Creek Regional Trail
- Pedestrian Bridge and Trail Improvements at Twin Lakes Park



RIVER RANCH COUNTY PARK

More than 1000 acres located off County Road 279 between Leander and Liberty Hill.

- Improvements including restrooms and pavilion

SOUTHWEST WILLIAMSON COUNTY REGIONAL PARK

Almost 800 acres located on CR 175 near RM 1431 in Leander.

- Improvements including restrooms



BERRY SPRINGS PARK AND PRESERVE

Located on 300-acres along Berry Springs between I.H. 35 and C.R. 152 with the main entrance off C.R. 152.

- Improvements including restrooms and pavilion

CHAMPION PARK

About 33 acres located off Brushy Creek Road in Cedar Park and connects to the Brushy Creek Regional Trail.

- Improvements including additional parking



WILLIAMSON COUNTY EXPO CENTER

Over 50 acres located at 5350 Bill Pickett Trail in Taylor.

- Improvements including cover on west arena and restrooms with showers at RV Park
