

Williamson County, Texas is responsible for operating Public Transportation Programs and implementing transit-related projects, which are funded in part with Federal financial assistance awarded by the U.S. Department of Transportation and the Federal Transit Administration, without discriminating against any person in the United States on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

Filing a Discrimination Complaint

Any person who believes they have been discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability may file a complaint directly with the Federal Transit Administration by filing a complaint with the Office of Civil Rights, Attention: Title VI Program Coordinator, East Building, 5th Floor-TCR, 1200 New Jersey Ave., SE, Washington, DC 20590.
