

# CR 366 WIDENING PROJECT

## FACT SHEET

**County Commissioner:** Commissioner Russ Boles, Precinct 4  
**Project Roadway:** CR 366  
**Project Limits:** Chandler Road to Carlos G. Parker Boulevard Northwest

### PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Williamson County is planning for the widening of County Road (CR) 366 from Chandler Road to Carlos G. Parker Boulevard Northwest. The existing CR 366 roadway has two lanes (one lane in each direction) with no shoulders, a sharp curve at the Carlos G. Parker Boulevard Northwest intersection, an open ditch drainage, culvert stream crossings, and multiple utilities in the corridor that need to be relocated prior to roadway expansion. The roadway currently has curves leading to intersections, which poses visibility and safety issues.

Improvements to CR 366 will include:

- Reconstructing as a five-lane roadway with a continuous center turn lane and shoulders
- Realigning roadway to eliminate curves at Carlos G. Parker Boulevard Northwest and Chandler Road intersections
- Adding a traffic signal at Carlos G. Parker Boulevard Northwest
- Intersection improvements to facilitate safer turn movements at CR 367 and CR 369
- Drainage improvements

### Timeline and Next Steps:

- **Mid 2018:** Received environmental clearance and began detailed design
- **Mid to Late 2020:** Complete detailed design
- **Mid to Late 2020:** Utility coordination and Right of Way acquisition
- **Early 2021:** Anticipated construction start








## PROJECT PURPOSE & NEED:

This project was requested by the City of Taylor to support the growing community and increased travel needs of residents today and in the future. Williamson County and the Taylor area have experienced immense growth in recent years and current population projections predict that this growth will continue. It is the County's responsibility to plan for transportation needs in order to keep pace with the increased number of residents and vehicles. This high level of growth requires extensive planning and development that will improve safety, connectivity, and mobility for residents, ultimately protecting their quality of life.
